### Illnesses in school

We have received the following information from Public Health Calderdale this week. Please read the advice carefully.

We are seeing lots of illness among school students since schools returned after half term. Some schools are experiencing small outbreaks of Slapped Cheek Syndrome (also called fifth disease or parvovirus B19) and COVID-19, alongside colds and viral infections.

Common symptoms being experienced are:

- High temperature
- Sore throats
- Headaches

Smaller numbers are experiencing:

- Cough
- Vomiting
- Stomach Cramps
- Rashes (in cases of Slapped Cheek)

Children should not attend school unless well enough to do so. They should not attend if they have a high temperature (38 degrees or above), and if experiencing diarrhoea/vomiting should not attend until 48 hours after the last episode of diarrhoea/vomiting.
